What does your role at the Commission entail?

As an investigator I conduct preliminary inquiries and investigations into reports alleging corrupt conduct and exercise the Commission's information and evidence gathering powers. This includes engaging with witnesses, liaising with persons who have made corruption complaints and obtaining information under summons or examination. I am often referred to as the 'case officer' for certain matters and use a wide range of investigative methodologies to identify and expose corruption.

Why are you passionate about working at the Commission?

What led me to working at the Commission is my passion for a 'pro-integrity culture' and being a part of embedding integrity into Government and agency culture, where it is a core consideration of all it does. I have always been drawn to be a part of an organisation which prides itself on doing the right thing and plays a role in instilling confidence in people to speak up when something isn't right.

What does your day-to-day look like?

Besides my day-to-day investigative work and tasks, I work closely with all Commission functions and am active in assisting with the establishment of various projects and internal processes.
