



Operation Kite Confidential Investigation Report

On 5 August 2024, the ACT Integrity Commission provided a Confidential Investigation Report on Operation Kite to the Standing Committee on Justice and Community Safety (JACS), pursuant to section 192 of the *Integrity Commission Act 2018* (the Act).

The Report concerned the investigation into the conduct of an employee of the Community Services Directorate and was confidential to protect the privacy of vulnerable witnesses. Pursuant to section 186 of the Act, the Commission must omit information that might identify certain people or is contrary to the public interest to disclose.

To meet the reporting obligations to the Assembly Committee under section 192 of the Act the Commission may include the information which has been omitted for these reasons. On this occasion, the Commission decided not to include personal identifying information in the Report because doing so was not reasonable, necessary or proportionate, given the impact on the right to privacy of witnesses in the particular circumstances.

There was no finding of corrupt conduct within this Report.

As this Report is confidential, it was not released publicly, and no further details will be made available to the public.

Under section 192 of the Act, a Confidential Investigation Report prepared by the ACT Integrity Commission must be provided by the Commission to the relevant Assembly Committee. A Confidential Investigation Report presented to the Committee is taken for all purposes to have been referred to the Committee by the Legislative Assembly for inquiry and any report that the Committee considers appropriate.

The JACS Committee completed an inquiry into the Report, which has made a number of findings. The JACS Committee inquiry findings were tabled in the Legislative Assembly on 4 September 2024 and are [available online](#).
