



Terms of Use – ACT Integrity Commission social media accounts

The ACT Integrity Commission does not accept reports of corrupt conduct via social media.

The following terms of use apply to the ACT Integrity Commission (the Commission) social media accounts. An individual or entity that posts or contributes to any of the Commission's social media accounts agrees to abide by these terms of use.

The Commission uses social media sites to share information on:

- corruption prevention resources and research
- upcoming Commission events, including public examinations
- education and communication initiatives
- publicly available investigation and special reports
- media releases
- other content as approved by the Commission.

Except for material posted by the Commission, any content, views, opinions, and responses to questions or views uploaded, expressed or submitted by the creators, sponsors, advertisers, or users of the Commission social media accounts, are solely the views, opinions, and responsibility of the person(s) submitting them and do not necessarily reflect the opinions of the Commission.

The Commission will not respond to individual tweets, comments, or messages and does not follow back new followers. Being followed, re-tweeted, or in any other way responded to does not imply endorsement of any kind by the Commission.

The Commission reserves the right to review, edit or delete any comments or responses it considers are inappropriate. Comments including, but not limited to, the following may be deleted or edited:

- inappropriate language (e.g. profanity, racial, ethnic or gender-based language as well as offensive abbreviations, or letter substitutions)
- abusive comments, personal attacks (including personality or ideological clashes between social media users), or defamatory statements about another person, the Commission, or its staff
- anything that could be considered prejudicial, vexatious, or offensive
- spam, irrelevant comments, or links to appeals, petitions, offers, events, groups, pages, websites, or organisations which are not related to the Commission
- comments that violate the privacy of people including Commission staff, members of the public, and/or other public officials
- comments which are illegal or likely to impact our operations, investigations, and/or hearings.
